CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

The lowest 23 scratch aggregates and those tying for 23rd place in the qualifying rounds together with the holder will compete in the Championship. In the event of withdrawals the Match and Handicap Committee will have authority to make the numbers playing in the Finals Day up to 24 minimum by inviting the next best qualifiers to take part. A tie for the Championship will be decided by a play-off over holes 1, 14, and 18. Should a further tie result 'sudden death' over the same three holes will then decide.

McLEOD CUP MATCH PLAY

The 15 lowest scratch aggregates in the best 2 of 3 nominated qualifying medal rounds, together with the holder, will qualify for the match play draw. In the event of withdrawals, the match and handicap committee will have the authority to make the numbers for the draw up to 16. Matches will be over 18 holes, with sudden death over holes 1, 12, and 18 if level after 18. The final will be played over 36 holes, with sudden death over the same holes if level after 36.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

Members are permitted to enter up to a maximum of 3 names on the Entry Sheets, but must accept responsibility for ensuring the availability to play of names entered. Any entrant not taking up his time must call off by telephoning the Starter. Failure to do so will result in suspension from the next Club competition, except that the Match & Handicap Committee will consider any appeal relating to extenuating circumstances.

MATCH PLAY 'KNOCK-OUT' COMPETITIONS

- 1. Challenge Bowl** - Singles competition. Full handicap allowance.
- 2. Craig Cup** - Full handicap allowance. One date given must be a Tuesday.
- 3. Services Cup** - Full h'cap allowance. Restricted to Members who have served in H.M. Forces and Merchant Navy.
- 4. O'Donnell Trophy** - Full h'cap allowance. Restricted to competitors having a h'cap of 12 or under.
- 5. Cairns Cup** - Foursomes. Allowance 1/2 difference of combined handicaps.

6. McLeod Cup - 15 lowest qualifiers + Holder in draw for match play off scratch.

7. Wright Cup - Mixed Foursomes. Allowance 1/2 difference of combined h'caps. Gentlemen to drive from 1st tee. Max lady's handicap of 36.

PAST PRESIDENT'S CUP - Awarded for the best scratch score in Medal Finals.

HON. PRESIDENT'S CUP - Awarded to the player with the lowest net aggregate for the Spring & Autumn Meetings.

PRIZE AWARD SYSTEM

In the event of a tie in any of the Club competitions (stroke or bogey), except the Club Championship, prizes will be awarded on the best return of net score over the last 9 holes of the card returned. Should a tie still result, the award will then be made to the player with the best net score over the last 6 holes. Should a tie still result, the best score over the last 3 holes, failing which the best last 2 holes, and if still failing, the best last hole, with handicap applied.

TUESDAY STROKE COMPETITION

Played on the Tuesday following each medal with the names of competitors entered, in person, on the list held by the Professional. This counts as a qualifying round and all cards must be returned.

TROPHIES

Trophies presented at the Club prizegiving should be returned to the trophy showcase in the Clubhouse by end February.

JUNIOR SECTION

1. Granger Trophy - Singles Competition. Full h'cap allowance.

2. Grant Rosebowl - Foursomes. Allowance 1/2 difference of combined handicaps.

3. Jack Sharp Trophy - Four ball better ball, 3 highest handicap players get 3/4 of the difference between their handicaps and the lowest handicap player.

4. Heywood Shield - Leading 16 players in Club Championship in a draw for match play off scratch. (In event of a tie for 16th place, the 1st qualifying score will decide).

An entrance fee of £1.00 will be charged in each competition other than monthly medal and medal finals.

CODE OF CONDUCT

A condition of Membership is that all Members agree to abide by the Rules of the Club and to observe the Etiquette of Golf.

A brief Code of Conduct for the guidance of Members is set out below:

1. The dress of all Members whether on the Course or in the Clubhouse shall be of appropriate standard. See Notice Board for the Main Lounge requirements.
2. No coats or hats are allowed in the Dining Room area.
3. Caddy carts are not allowed in any part of the Locker Room area or to obstruct the entrance.
4. Practice shall only take place on the designated practice area.
5. No Member will reprimand a Club employee. All complaints must be made to the Secretary in writing.

BYE-LAWS

1. DEFINITION

For the purposes of these Bye-laws the expression "Member" shall relate to the Gentlemen and Ladies who enjoy full membership rights and are included as part of the 450 (full) members of the Club. The expression "Associate Member" shall relate to any other category, either lady, gentleman, youth or junior, as may be determined from time to time by the Directors.

In the construction of these Bye-laws, words importing the singular shall include the plural number also, and vice-versa, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine gender.

2. MEMBERSHIP

- 2.1 Full Membership of the Club is open to Ladies and Gentlemen whose application is endorsed by a proposer and seconder, both Members of the Club and who have personal knowledge of the applicant. The applicant will, in due course, be called upon to attend an interview and accompanied by his proposer and/or seconder, and thereafter, may be elected to membership or associate membership or placed on a waiting list in either category.
- 2.2 Names and addresses of persons proposed for full membership of the Club shall be displayed on the Club noticeboard for at least a week before their election and an interval of not less than two weeks shall elapse between the nomination and election of members.
- 2.3 The waiting lists in Member or Associate categories will be operated in rotation strictly upon the date of receipt of an application.
- 2.4 No candidate whose application for membership has been rejected by the Directors shall be introduced as a guest at any future date.
- 2.5 Application by a Member to transfer to Associate status will be considered only if five full subscriptions have been paid by such member.

3. ASSOCIATE MEMBERSHIP

The categories of associate membership shall be as determined, from time to time, by the Directors. The conditions for existing categories are defined as :

- 3.1 Associate : Ladies or Gentlemen who have been elected to this category or who have been transferred to this category from full membership status with approval of the Board. Numbers in this category are restricted to 200. Applications for Associate membership are endorsed by a proposer and seconder, both Members of the Club, and the candidate will, on approval, be placed on a waiting list separate to member applicants. Names and addresses of persons proposed for Associate membership of the Club shall be displayed on the Club noticeboard for at least a week before their election and an interval of not less than two weeks shall elapse between the nomination and election of Associates. Applicants for full membership may be granted a place in the associate category, as available, and must transfer to full membership on an offer being made.
- 3.2 Life Member : a lady or gentleman, being in membership and who, having attained the age of 65 years, has paid 30 annual subscriptions and who has applied to the Board for transfer to this category. Life members enjoy full playing rights but no other rights apply. If no longer playing, no subscription is due.
- 3.3 Associate Life Member : a lady or gentleman, being in Associate Membership and who, having attained the age of 65 years has paid 30 annual subscriptions either as a member or associate member and who has applied to the Board for transfer to this category. Associate Life Members enjoy the playing rights that apply to Associate Members, but no other rights apply. If no longer playing, no subscription is due.
- 3.4 Youth Member: a male or female who has attained the age of 18 years as of the qualifying date of 1st January in any year and who is under 30 years prior to the last day of December in any year. Youth Members enjoy full playing rights, but no other rights apply. There is no maximum number applied to this category and Youth Members will automatically transfer, on payment of the appropriate entry fee, to Full Membership at the age of 30 years on the qualifying date of 1st January, even should the membership numbers temporarily exceed 450. Youth Members may make application for Full Membership at any time.
- 3.5 Junior Members : Open to boys and girls aged 10 to 18 years, or as determined by the Board, as of the qualifying date of 1st January in any year and whose application is endorsed by

two members as proposer and seconder. Category numbers will be determined by the Board.

- 3.6 Country Member : open to any lady or gentleman whose permanent residence is outwith a 75 mile radius of the Clubhouse and whose application is endorsed by two Members as proposer and seconder. An existing Member or Associate Member removing to take up residence outwith 75 miles may make application to the Board for transfer to this category. Country Members enjoy full playing rights except that they may play within, but not as part of club competitions, but enjoy no other rights. Category numbers are restricted to 45.

Any Member or Associate Member who has been transferred to this category and who returns to take up permanent residence inside the 75 mile radius must make application to the Board for transfer back to membership or associate membership, determined by their status prior to transfer, and shall be placed at the head of the waiting list in the relevant category immediately after any transfers from Youth to Full status.

- 3.7 House Membership : ladies and gentlemen may apply to the Board for transfer to this category to a maximum of 50. A new application for election to this category should be endorsed by two members or associate members as proposer and seconder. The application may be posted, seeking support of members and the applicant invited for interview. The category carries no playing rights or the right to be introduced as a guest player but allows access to the facilities of the clubhouse at any time.
- 3.8 Honorary Member : this category is reserved for persons who have given outstanding service to the Club or Game and who are elected to this category by the Directors. The Honorary President and any Honorary Vice-Presidents are Honorary Members. Honorary Members enjoy all the privileges of membership except that they have no voting rights.
- 3.9 Staff Associates : the category in which Club employees enjoy the full playing rights of Members but which carries no voting rights. Staff members wishing to play in Club competitions may apply for membership as per para 2.1
- 3.10 Temporary Associate : the category accorded to applicants for a specified temporary period. Application should be supported by two Members as proposer and seconder.
- 3.11 Corporate Member : the category available to companies or

other bodies corporate, to a maximum of 10, with 4 membership cards freely transferrable to their nominees. Playing rights are limited and no other rights apply.

- 3.12 Special Associate : this closed category applies, for the time being, to existing Associates at the discretion of the Board. No new applications in this category are entertained.
- 3.13 Family Membership : This category is available to any family who as individuals are either a member or associate member. All rights apply as per the relevant membership category.

4. ENTRY FEES

- 4.1 Member : the entry fee payable by every candidate on being offered a place in Full membership shall be charged at £980.
- 4.2 Associate : the entry fee payable by every candidate on being offered a place in Associate membership shall be charged at £735.00.
- 4.3 Country Associate : the entry fee payable by every candidate on being offered Country membership shall be 175% of the annual subscription then current in that category.
- 4.4 Corporate Associate : the entry fee payable by each company or body corporate shall be 175% of the full member's subscription then current.
- 4.5 Junior Associate : the entry fee applied to this category shall be 50% of the subscription then current in the category or as determined from time to time by the Directors.

The entry fee payable by a Junior who has transferred into the Youth category on reaching the age of 18 years on or after 1st January in any year shall be:

- 4.6 Youth members shall receive 10% off the entry fee for every year served as a Youth member.
- 4.7 Entry Fees may be paid in four equal instalments for Full Members and in three equal instalments for Associate members, the first payable on admission and the second instalment not later than 30th November in the year of admission. The third (and final for Associate Members) shall be paid together with the annual subscription for the second season of membership with the fourth instalment (for Full Members) not later than 30th November in the second year of membership.

New (full) Members, however, who elect to pay the entry fee by instalments shall not be eligible to receive notice, attend or vote at any general meeting of the Club until the final instalment has been paid.

- 4.8 The percentages of the then annual subscription (as quoted above) that are applied to entry fees in any category are subject to amendment at any time.

5. ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION

- 5.1 Annual subscriptions are payable on 1st.March each year and the subscription year ends on the following last day in February. The subscription in respect of Members is determined by the Members each year in General Meeting and the amount due by associate categories is expressed below as a percentage of that full membership subscription:

or such other percentages that may be determined by the Directors.

- 5.3 In the event of the failure of a member or Associate member in any category to pay the annual subscription within 31 days from 1st March, or fall two payments in arrears when paying by direct debit, that member will be barred from any entry into any club competition or use of the club facilities unless otherwise agreed by the Board. The directors have the power at their next meeting to remove his or her name from the registers of members or associate members.
- 5.4 The annual subscription may be paid by 3 methods :
- (i) One payment on the due date, which payment may

include vouchers which are on sale at the bar throughout the year.

- (ii) By direct debit of the estimated amount in advance, with the final payment due 31st March, which amount balances the subscription due.
- (iii) By use of the facility offered by a credit agreement approved by the Board, the application form for which must be in the hands of the Club Secretary by 15th.March, with existing users of such a scheme having their debits automatically adjusted.

- 5.5 Where Members or Associate members are admitted in the course of a season the subscription due will be calculated on a pro-rata basis by way of the remaining months in the subscription year. In the same way any member or associate member transferring to a different category shall have the subscription due re-calculated on the basis of the months spent in each category.
- 5.6 Should the members in general meeting agree the imposition of a levy to meet specific capital costs, Associates, Special Associates, Life Members and Associate Life members will be charged at an amount calculated on a pro rata basis against the full levy. Where members in general meeting agree an Annual Bar prepayment levy, this shall be charged to members and to the foregoing categories of membership at a rate to be established by the Directors from time to time. Non-payment of any agreed levy will be treated in the same way as non-payment of subscription, as per para 5.3.
- 5.7 All subscriptions are stated nett, with subscriptions due to the Unions and SLGA added to the nett amount due.

6. RESIGNATION

- 6.1 Members or Associate Members wishing to resign must intimate their resignation in writing to the Club Secretary on or before the date of the Annual General Meeting in any year, otherwise liability will be incurred for the subscription falling due on 1st.March following.
- 6.2 Members or Associate members who have resigned may be re-admitted at a future date, by consent of the Board but without the formality of being proposed and seconded, In both categories re-election carries no priority on the waiting lists and they will be offered a place in the appropriate category when available. Any entry fee due will be determined by the Directors.

- 6.3 The Directors have the power to suspend membership or associate membership for a given period where application is made on the grounds of illness, hardship or any other exceptional circumstance, the application being made in writing to the Club Secretary. Should the member be granted suspension in whole of the annual subscription, the member must take up House Membership on a year to year basis.
- 6.4 Disciplinary matters are considered by an appointed sub-committee chaired by the Vice-Captain who have powers, with Board approval, to suspend a member for a stated period. A member so suspended has the right of appeal to the Club Captain and may not use the facilities of the Club or be introduced as a guest during the period of suspension. Should a member be required to resign from the Club, he will not be introduced at any future date except as per the provisions of Article 6 of the Articles of Association.

7. CONDITIONS RELATING TO ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

- 7.1 Times of play are as follows:

Associates: Monday to Friday, inclusive, all day. Saturday and Sunday - after 5pm. Sundays during winter hours (Nov - Mar) after 12.30pm.

Life Members: no restrictions.

Associate Life Members: Monday to Friday, inclusive, all day. Saturday and Sunday - after 5pm. Sundays during winter hours after 12.30pm.

Country Members: no restrictions, but no competition play.

Staff Associates: no restrictions, but no competition play.

Special Associates: Sunday to Friday, inclusive, all day. Saturday after 3.30

Juniors: Monday to Friday, inclusive, except between the hours of 4.30pm and 6.30pm on Tuesday and Thursday and before 10am or between noon and 1.30pm on Tuesday competition days. Saturday: on competition days – following the close of the competition otherwise after 3.30pm. During winter months after 12.30pm. Sunday – on competition days – following the close of the competition , otherwise after 12.30pm. Juniors playing in the Tuesday competition will be allowed to tee off between the hours of noon and 1.30pm and 4.30pm and 6.30pm.

Corporate Members - subject to conditions agreed by the Board.

- 7.2 Members will observe the reservation of tee times as they concern Associate categories.

- 7.3 In addition to the hours set out in bye-law 7.1 Juniors when playing in a Gents competition are permitted to tee off after 11.30am on a Saturday and between the hours of noon and 1.30pm and 4.30pm and 6.30pm on a Tuesday.

8. CONDITIONS RELATING TO TEMPORARY MEMBERS

- 8.1 The Directors, at their discretion, may admit members of any club or association as Temporary Members for one or more days on such terms and conditions as they think fit.
- 8.2 No-one who has been refused admission as a member or associate member will be admitted in temporary membership.
- 8.3 Subject to the provisions of these bye-laws, Temporary Members shall enjoy the use of the clubhouse and course, except that they shall not be entitled to play in Club competition, save where authorised by the terms of the competition.
- 8.4 The Directors reserve the right to withdraw any form of Temporary Membership without stating any reason.
- 8.5 Special Temporary Membership is accorded to the Immediate Past Captain of each club in the Paisley & District Golf League and his two predecessors in office.

9. GUESTS

- 9.1 Members and Associate Members (other than Temporary Members) may introduce ladies, gentlemen and Juniors as guests (when they remain in their company) or as Visitors (when not in their company), subject always to these bye-laws.
- 9.2 Guests to the Clubhouse only may be introduced at any time, but such guests must remain in the company of the member or associate member and are not entitled to play the course. The names of such guests will be entered in the Visitors' Book and the member must accept responsibility for the suitability of dress and the conduct of their guest. Where members or their guests have children under 12 years of age in their company, they should use the family room off the main lounge or the A.P.Scott lounge and ensure that children do not encroach on the bar area.
- 9.3 Guests to the Clubhouse and Course may be introduced subject to the following conditions :
- (i) The names of such guests will be entered in the Visitors' Book in the Professional's shop.
 - (ii) The number of playing guests introduced on any one occasion shall not exceed three.
 - (iii) The same guest shall not be introduced by any one (or

- alternatively by one or different members or associate members) more than six times in any subscription year.
- (iv) Each member or associate member is entitled to introduce six guests free of charge each season. The membership card must be presented to the Club Professional prior to play. A Member or Associate member may not introduce more than a total of 20 guests in the course of a season..
 - (v) After the allowance of free introductions has been used, the week-day greenfee and the week-end greenfee will be as determined from time to time by the Directors and published in the membership card.
 - (vi) Receipts for greenfees, if payable, must be obtained from the Club Professional prior to the commencement of play.
 - (vii) Receipts for greenfees must be produced, whenever demanded, by any Director or official of the Club.
 - (viii) Guests shall not play in any club competition except where authorised by the terms of the competition.
 - (ix) Guests shall be subject to the Bye-laws affecting members or associate members respectively.
 - (x) Junior Associate Members may introduce as free guests only boys or girls under the age of 18 years. Any adult visitor introduced will be subject to the guest greenfee that applies.
 - (xi) No person who has been refused membership of the Club shall be introduced as a guest by a member.

10. VISITORS

- 10.1 Visitors must report to the Professional's shop and, if the course is available, pay the appropriate fee prior to starting
- 10.2 The course is not open to Visitors at week-ends.
- 10.3 Visitors numbering more than 8 people are deemed to be a visiting party.
- 10.4 Conditions relating to Visiting Parties :
 - a) Application will be made to the Club Secretary by the person nominated as being in charge of the party and responsible for their conduct on Course and in the Clubhouse.
 - b) Members of a visiting party should be in possession of a current handicap..
 - c) To conform with the licensing laws party members must sign the visitors' book in the clubhouse.
 - d) A deposit against greenfees will have been previously

paid to the Secretary and the balance of greenfees will be paid to the Secretary or Club Professional prior to play.

- e) The tee times allocated must be strictly observed.
- f) The party organiser will ensure that any account payable to the caterer and any monies due to the bar are met in full prior to departure.
- g) Members of visiting parties are subject to the same Bye-laws as members and to dress regulations on course and in the clubhouse.
- (h) No person who has been refused membership of the Club shall be introduced in a visiting party and the Club reserves the right to withdraw the status of Visitor from any member of a visiting party without giving reason.

11. CLUBHOUSE - GENERAL RULES

- 11.1 The clubhouse will be opened and closed at such times as the Directors shall from time to time determine. These hours vary between summer hours and winter hours, with the times posted in the clubhouse for the information of members.
- 11.2 No Member or Associate member shall take or permit to be taken from the clubhouse any book, magazine or other article which is the property of the Club without the authority of the Directors or Secretary.
- 11.3 No placard or notice shall be placed on the walls of the Club rooms or otherwise be publically displayed therein or on any property of the Club except by the authority of the Directors or Secretary.
- 11.4 Members or Associate members shall, before leaving the clubhouse, settle whatever expenses they may have incurred.
- 11.5 All complaints shall be made in writing to the Directors through the Secretary. In no instance shall an employee of the Club or the Club's caterer be reprimanded directly by any Member or Associate member.
- 11.6 The Club shall not be responsible to Members or Associates or to others for loss of or damage to any property brought into the clubhouse.
- 11.7 The use of mobile 'phones is not permitted in any of the front Club lounges.
- 11.8 The following conditions apply to the sale of excisable liquors:

- a) The Directors shall determine beers, wines and spirits may be obtained in the clubhouse and price thereof.
- b) No Director, manager or employee of the Club shall have any personal interest in the sale of excisable liquor or in the profits arising from such sales.
- c) No excisable liquor shall be sold or supplied except to Members or Associate members.
- d) No excisable liquor shall be sold or supplied to persons under the age of 18 years.
- e) No excisable liquor shall be sold to any person for consumption outside the premises of the Club except to a Member, Associate or to visitors and guests whose names have been entered in the visitors' book and which is for their own consumption.
- f) The sale or supply of alcoholic liquor shall, at all times, be in accordance with the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1976. The Directors will post within the clubhouse the bar hours that apply, but reserve the right to restrict such hours. The clubhouse is not open on New Year's Day
- g) No excisable liquor shall be brought into the clubhouse by a member, visitor or guest for consumption on the premises without the express permission of the Board..

11.9 Dress standards in the clubhouse are as follows:

- a) Main Lounge - smart casual wear, but track or shell suits are specifically barred Further, any outdoor wear or playing clothes that have been soiled or wet are unacceptable.
- b) Family Lounge - as for Main Lounge but relaxed for children under 12. Members introducing children under the age of 12 years should use this lounge and ensure that the children do not encroach on the main lounge area.
- c) Scott Lounge - smart casual wear, but relaxed as to the requirements in use of the Main Lounge.
- d) Dining Area – as for Main Lounge but on formal club function occasions the wearing of jacket, collar & tie is requested.
- e) Clubhouse - general - the wearing of golf shoes is not permitted outwith the locker rooms

11.10 Lockers: requests for lockers should be addressed to the Secretary who will place the request on the waiting list The rental charge for locker use will be as determined from time to time by the Directors.

11.11 Caddy trollies shall not be taken into the locker rooms

12. CLUB & COMPETITION PLAY

- 12.1 Club play is controlled by a starting sheet located in the Professional's shop and all players must report to the shop prior to play. Starting times are at 7 minute intervals and every second time is bookable in advance up to 7 days previous, either in person or by telephone. The alternate times are only available on the day by players who remain within the precincts of the Club. Any pre-booked cancellations should be advised to the Professional.
- 12.2 Competition entry in Medal and Stroke competitions is by completion of name on the starting sheet which is placed on the notice board on the Monday at 6.00pm, 12 days prior to the competition date. No member should complete more than three names on the start sheet and should understand that his playing partners will definitely take part in the competition. The sheet is situated in the professional's shop on the morning of the competition and any cancellations should be advised to the professional by phone
- 12.3 As per the rules of competition, a member missing his appointed tee time is disqualified from the competition and any member whose name is on the starting sheet but neither so cancels or fails to turn up will be barred from entry into the next week-end Club competition.
- 12.4 No member in subscription default as of 1st. April may take part in club competitive play or use the Club facilities until the overdue fee has been paid.
- 12.5 No entry fee is levied for Medal competitions although a fee will normally apply in Stroke competitions. A sweep will operate, with optional participation, with 1st., 2nd. & 3rd. prize money normally divided in the ration 50:30:20 to the best net scores.
- 12.6 Where there are equal net scores in Medal and Stroke play competitions, the winner is decided on count-back over the inward half.
- 12.7 In the course of a competition round, should the course become unplayable, play will be suspended by the sound of a klaxon. Players are advised to read the instruction on the Match & Handicap noticeboard that apply should this circumstance arise.
- 12.8 Players with starred or lapsed handicaps may not enter Club competitions. It should be noted that. CONGU Rules apply - see Club noticeboard.

- 12.9 An official handicap will be awarded when 3 scorecards have been returned to the Match & Handicap Committee (one of which shall be off medal tees) and which cards have been authenticated by the holder of a current handicap (not necessarily a Club Member).
A starred (or social golf) handicap is awarded should a Member or Associate Member return fewer than 3 qualifying scores within any season.
- 12.10 The closing dates for entry to Club Summer match play competitions are 19th April with entry fees payable to the Match & Handicap Secretary. Each tie should be arranged well ahead of the closing date for that round. The first-named in the draw is the challenger who should make early contact with his opponent, but both parties should accept responsibility for making contact, especially if holiday dates have been arranged.
- 12.11 Should the challenger repeatedly fail to make contact with an opponent, he should offer 3 dates (one of which must be a week-end day) in the book for that purpose which is located behind the bar. In any dispute the decision of the Match & Handicap Committee is final
- 12.12 On course, players not taking part in a Club competition should give way to matchplay competitors.
- 12.13 Competition and matchplay is from the white tee markers. All other play must be from the yellow markers. Ladies play from the red tee markers and blue tee markers have been established for higher handicap juniors. Junior medal play is from the yellow markers and juniors holding a handicap of standard agreed by the Directors may play from the yellow markers in casual play. Juniors holding a handicap of 10 or below may, after 11.30am, play with, but not as part of, any club competition.
- 12.14 Players joining the course or cutting in have no standing on the course and must ensure that the game behind has not left the tee and that the hole is completely free before cutting in. Further, players cutting in in this way must give way to players who are completing a full round.
- 12.15 All players should acquaint themselves with current Local Rules which are printed in the scorecard, with possible amendments posted in the clubhouse on the M&H noticeboard.
- 12.16 Club Championship - this is competed for by Members of the Club who qualify via the best two gross scores out of

three designated qualifying rounds. The lowest 23 scratch aggregates and those tying for 23rd. place compete in medal play, together with the defending champion. The Match & Handicap Committee may, in the event of withdrawals, make up the numbers playing in the Finals Day to 24 minimum by inviting the next best qualifiers to take part. A tie for the championship will be decided by a play-off over holes 1,14 & 18. Should a further tie result, 'sudden death' over the same 3 holes will then decide.

- 12.17 Match Play Championship (McLeod Cup) – This is competed for by members of the club. The 15 lowest scratch aggregates in the best 2 of 3 nominated qualifying medal rounds, together with the holder, will qualify for the match play draw. In the event of withdrawals, the match and handicap committee will have the authority to make the numbers for the draw up to 16. Matches will be over 18 holes, with sudden death over holes 1, 12, and 18 if level after 18. The final will be played over 36 holes, with sudden death over the same holes if level after 36.
- 12.18 In Club matchplay ties, the competitors should agree prior to teeing off, what course of action to follow should the game be level after 18 holes. The tie may be decided by both parties agreeing to continue from the 1st. tee until there is a result or agreeing to replay the tie. Should no such agreement have been reached, the tie should be re-played.
- 12.19 Dress standards on the course are accepted golfing apparel and golf shoes. Tailored shorts are acceptable when worn with sports socks. Denim jeans, sleeveless or collarless shirts and track and shell suits are specifically barred as are men's shirts being worn outside trousers or trousers tucked into socks. Sleeveless blouses designed to be worn outside skirts or trousers are, however, acceptable.
- 12.20 The Club Officers, members of the Greens Committee and the Head Greenkeeper or his staff have authority to close the course at any time when the course may be considered unplayable and to re-open it when appropriate,
- 12.21 No dogs shall be taken into the clubhouse or onto the course.
- 12.22 It is not acceptable for Members, their Guests or Visitors to change in the car park
- 12.23 Mobile 'phones, if taken onto the course, must be switched off.
- 12.24 No Member or Associate member shall take issue with or reprimand a member of greens staff and any cause for

complaint should be referred to the Directors through the Secretary.

12.25 The Club Captain is accorded priority on the 1st tee at all times

13. GENERAL

13.1 The Board of Directors may amend the foregoing bye-laws or create new clauses at any time and such amendments will be enforced one week after having been posted on the Club noticeboard.

13.2 Members may, at any general meeting, by a simple majority of those present, make alterations in or additions to the foregoing bye-laws (including any alterations affecting the rate or amount of the annual subscription of Members) provided due notice of the proposed alteration or addition shall have been given in the Notice calling the meeting. If the Directors receive intimation in writing addressed to them at the Registered Office of the Club and signed by not less than 45 Members of an intention to propose an alteration in, or addition to, the foregoing Bye-Laws, then provided that such information is received by 31st December prior to the next following Annual General Meeting of the Club the Directors shall procure that due notice of the proposed alteration or addition is given in the notice concerning such Meeting. Any such amendment or addition approved at a general meeting shall remain as a current Bye-Law except as revised or repealed by Members in general meeting.

13.3 No changes to the course will be undertaken without a majority of the Board of Directors approving a recommendation of the Development Committee.

13.4 These Bye-Laws shall supersede the existing Bye-Laws
